

WINTER UPHILL TRAVEL POLICY Updated 1/28/25

- All uphill skier/boarder traffic is prohibited when Jiminy Peak is not open for daily skiing operations. Uphill travel may begin at 7:00 AM when the resort is open for daily skiing operations.
- All skiers/boarders traveling uphill must have a valid pass or ticket (either an uphill season pass armband or a day pass ticket).
 - Uphill day and season passes are available for purchase at the Season Pass window in Crane Lodge.
 - Uphill New England (UNE) multi-mountain passes are available for purchase through the UNE website.
 - Jiminy Peak recommends uphill travelers download and check the UNE mobile app for the latest information before proceeding uphill.
 - The UNE check-in station is located at the bottom of the Ace of Spades trail.
- WARNING! In accordance with Massachusetts law, a skier assumes the risk of any injury or loss resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing and may not recover from any ski area operator for any injury resulting from any of the inherent dangers and risks of skiing including variations in terrain, surface or subsurface snow, ice conditions or bare spots; collision with natural objects, man-made objects or other skiers; and the failure of skiers to ski within their own abilities. Your uphill travel (and resulting downhill travel) is at your own risk!
- Ski Patrol at Jiminy Peak is only available during regular operating hours (not necessarily during early morning uphill operating hours) when the resort is open for skiing operations.
- The primary route for uphill travel is the John Hancock trail to West Way trail. If John Hancock is not open, the secondary route for uphill travel is the Grand Slam trail to West Way trail. Uphill and downhill travel is prohibited on closed trails. The UNE app will show the permitted uphill travel route for the day.
- All uphill skiers must travel single file only along the right side of the designated uphill trail.
- All skis or snowboards must be equipped with a brake or leash.
- Jiminy Peak reserves the right to close uphill trails or terminate uphill travel without notice.
- Stay clear of all snowmaking and snow grooming operations. Winch cable grooming may be in operation both day and night.
- Pets are not permitted on trails.
- Sledding, tubing, sliding on trays, or other devices that are not skis or snowboards (regular or adaptive) are strictly prohibited on all trails.
